# THS Students Brighten Kindergartners' Day

In this season of giving, our district has so many examples of kindness and generosity. Here's another example:

What began as a way to recycle materials used at the Technology High School (THS) prom resulted in a school service project that had leadership students creating stuffed animals with and reading books to T-K and kindergarten students at John Reed Elementary.

The theme of the THS homecoming dance was "Under the Stars", where clouds were created using polyfill. Students were considering ways to recycle the polyfill, and ultimately decided that using it to stuff plush animals to give to children would not only recycle the materials, but also brighten a child's day.

## MTSS Grant Awarded to Promote Student Success

Our Education Services Team applied for and we were awarded an MTSS grant to aid our work in aligning our systems to promote student success. The schools identified for the grant are: Richard Crane, John Reed, Thomas Page Academy, Technology Middle School and Lawrence Jones Middle School

The California Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) is an integrated, comprehensive framework that focuses on CCSS, core instruction, differentiated learning, student-centered learning, individualized student needs, and the alignment of systems necessary for all students' academic, behavioral, and social success.

Here are some details:

**Purpose:** This grant funds stipends and release time for educators to participate in and complete MTSS Pathway Certification for Schools course during the grant phase. Each school site administrator will be provided a coach to assist in the planning and implementation of the CA MTSS Framework and the CA MTSS Pathway Certification for Schools course.

**Alignment to CRPUSD Goals:** MTSS is a research-based approach to providing students with the right level of support at the right time. This is a Whole Child approach to education that includes academics and Social Emotional Learning. The training and coaching provided will enhance our Leadership Team in application of the Cycle of Continuous Improvement.

**Grant Details:** The 5 schools in our application will receive \$50,000 each and the District as the agency will receive \$15,000 for leadership support. Awardees of the grant will engage in the process March 2022 - June 2026.

**Our Commitment:** Schools agree to having at least 90% of their staff complete the MTSS Pathway Certification for Schools course. Estimated course completion time frame: 40-60 hours beginning March 2022 - June 2026. We must also evaluate school conditions and climate, engage in the continuous improvement process to create systemic change needed to improve outcomes for all learners and gather and submit data, including, but not limited to: FIA, Schoolwide Implementation Tool, attendance, discipline, school climate and perception surveys.

We look forward to beginning this important work in the district and in our schools!
