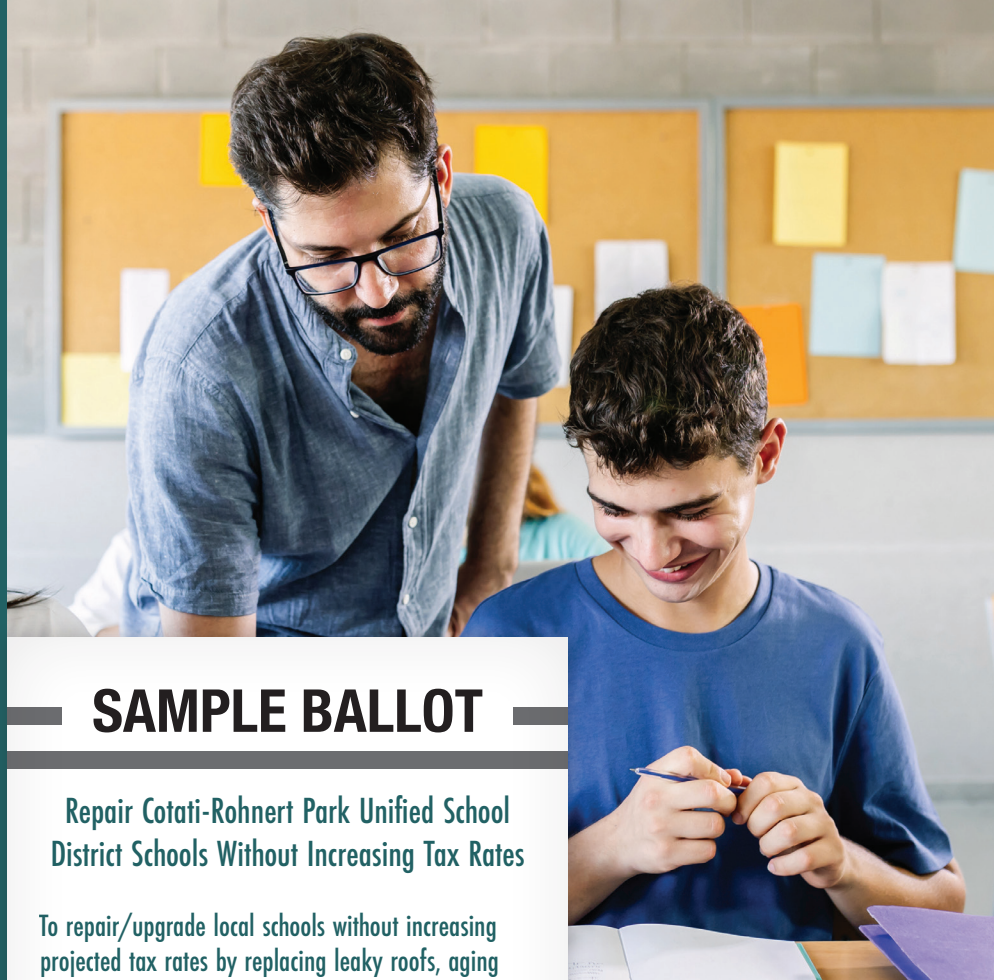

Repair Cotati-Rohnert Park Unified School District Schools Without Increasing Tax Rates

To repair/upgrade local schools without increasing projected tax rates by replacing leaky roofs, aging plumbing/HVAC; removing hazardous materials including asbestos/lead; upgrading science, technology, engineering, math classrooms/labs; and replacing deteriorating portable classrooms; shall Cotati-Rohnert Park Unified School District's measure authorizing \$91,500,000 in bonds at legal rates be adopted, levying approximately \$35 per \$100,000 assessed value while bonds are outstanding (\$5,400,000 annually) with independent oversight, audits, no funds for administrators?

REPAIRING AND UPGRADING LOCAL SCHOOLS TO MAINTAIN QUALITY EDUCATION

Cotati-Rohnert Park Unified School District (CRPUSD) serves over 6,000 local students at 12 schools. Our District is home to award-winning, nationally recognized schools where students are provided a strong education.



REPAIRING AGING LOCAL SCHOOLS

CRPUSD schools have served the community for generations, but many of our schools were built decades ago and are in need of urgent repairs and upgrades to support quality education. Our schools have more than 80 portable classrooms across CRPUSD that students are learning in. Many of the portables are deteriorating and well beyond their useful lives, and need to be replaced to provide students with safe and efficient classrooms.


ALLOWING OUR STUDENTS TO KEEP PACE

Other districts in Sonoma County have passed funding measures for their communities. A similar local funding measure would allow for basic repairs and upgrades so local students would have access to the quality education that other students in the region already have.

MEASURE BB EXTENDS CURRENT TAX RATES WITH NO INCREASE TO UPGRADE CRPUSD SCHOOLS

To fix and repair CRPUSD schools, the Board of Trustees placed a school improvement bond measure, Measure BB, on the November 2024 ballot that is projected to simply extend the current combined CRPUSD bond tax rate, without increasing current tax rates, to generate approximately \$91.5 million to fund local school repairs and upgrades, including:

 Replacing leaky roofs, aging plumbing and HVAC systems

 Upgrading science, technology, engineering, math and career training labs and facilities




 Removing hazardous materials including asbestos and lead pipes

 Providing updated equipment for classrooms, science and computer labs and libraries

 Replacing outdated, aging and deteriorating temporary portable classrooms

FISCAL ACCOUNTABILITY AND LOCAL CONTROL

Measure BB continues existing fiscal accountability requirements, including:

-  All funds raised will be controlled locally, will improve our local schools, and cannot be taken away by the State
-  By law, none of the money raised by the measure will be used for administrators' salaries
-  An independent citizens' oversight committee and mandatory annual audits ensure that the money is spent as promised
