Retirement and Volunteer Recognition

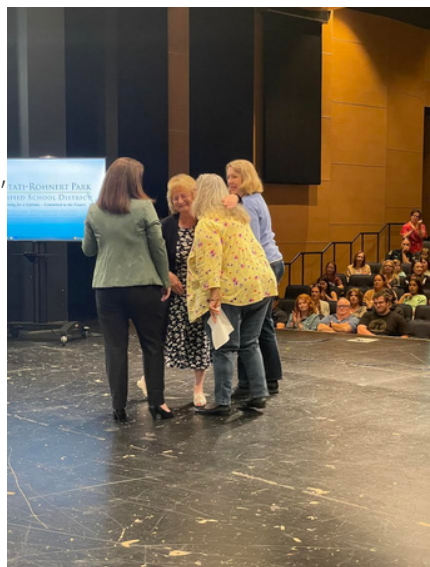

The Board of Education appointed new principals to our district effective July 1, 2023.

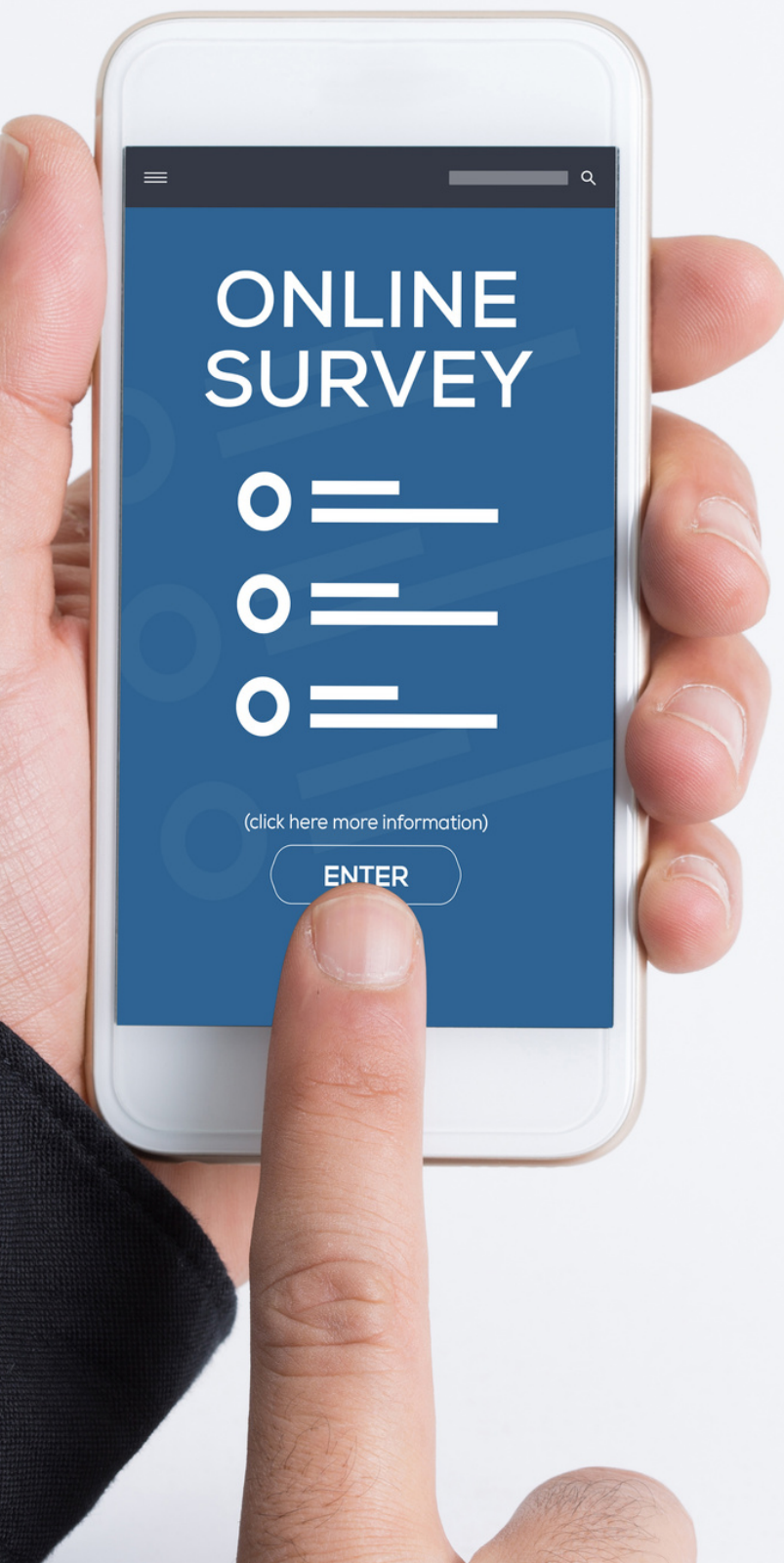
Rocky Schumann will serve as the new new principal for El Camino High. He is caring, compassionate, and brings a depth of experience to this position.

COVID-19 Emergency Ended

This communication is intended to notify you of changes to your benefits due to the end of the National Emergency and Public Health Emergency related to COVID-19 effective May 11, 2023.

Vaccines and Testing. Generally, effective May 12, 2023, vaccines, testing, and other services related to COVID-19 will be treated like any other condition, and the normal rules of your plan will apply, including ordinary in-network cost-sharing such as deductibles and coinsurance, as applicable. Out of network (OON) services, if covered, may be covered at lower rates and may be subject to OON participant cost-sharing. These benefits may vary depending on your provider.

End of Temporary Suspension of Participant Deadlines

All temporary suspensions of participant deadlines, such as those for electing COBRA, making COBRA premium payments, requesting HIPAA special enrollment, and for filing claims and appeals, will end on July 10, 2023, which is 60 days after the end of the COVID-19 National Emergency.

Any previously suspended participant deadlines will begin to run again on this date. For new events occurring prior to July 11, 2023, the remaining days in the “Outbreak Period” will not be counted towards these deadlines. Any new deadline starting on or after July 11, 2023, will revert to established deadlines as noted in the summary plan description for your plan.

Accordingly, as of July 11, 2023, all COBRA elections and premium payments must be made timely, and claims and appeals should be submitted in accordance with the plan documents.
